DEFINITION OF “REENTRY”: OPSR defines the term *reentry* to be that group of services that a person reentering society from prison needs to be successfully integrated back into their community.

OPSR has developed the following “Reentry Services Index” (“RSI”) to quantify the full spectrum of services:

- basic needs (food, clothing, shelter)
- Bible studies
- camps, children/youth
- career counseling

- child support assistance and deferral

- employment opportunities
- family reunification
- financial assistance (program fees, apartment deposits and start-up rent, utility deposits, cell-phone, auto insurance, etc.).

- identification needs (birth certificate, citizenship, OKDL, SSI, etc.),
- insurance, health
- job training
- life skills
- literacy
- medical services (general, medications, dental, optical, mental health)

- spiritual support

- transition coordination
- transportation
- treatment, mental health
